We know trees cool our cities, however, their cooling ability is rarely quantified. Dr. Mohammad Asrafur Rahman of the Technical University of Munich, Germany, sought to do just that and determine if trees' cooling capacity could be estimated from their growth rate. In the study, "Quantifying the cooling effectiveness of urban street trees in relation to their growth," funded in part by a Jack Kimmel International Grant, he analyzed two tree species in contrasting street canyon conditions. He not only

discovered large differences in cooling potential between the species and conditions but also found that water use efficiency is more strongly related to cooling potential than growth rate. Dr. Rahman continues to build on his findings and aims to create a model for predicting the impact of urban trees on urban microclimates.
