### Your donations are making a difference!



We all know that it's not easy for urban trees to coexist with pavement. However, few studies have measured the true impact over time. Using a Jack Kimmel International Grant to extend short-term work on this topic, Dr. Alessio Fini (University of Florence, Italy) quantified the effect of pervious (curb on crushed stone sub-base), impervious (asphalt on concrete sub-base) and permeable pavement (resin bound pavement on crushed stone sub-base) on tree physiology, soil characteristics, and the microclimate of the paved areas. "Effects of different sidewalk designs on soil characteristics and on

the growth and physiology of shade tree species" established that compared to the other pavement options, porous pavements alter the water cycle less, accumulate less CO2, and are better at mitigating changes to soil traits. Dr. Fini's work will be useful in developing best practices for urban planners and arborists managing city greenspaces.

How safe is this tree? It's a critical question that demands an accurate answer, but assessment is not always straightforward. Learn to avoid the pitfalls of tree risk assessment as Dr. Koeser highlights sources of variation and potential bias when rating a tree's likelihood of impact, likelihood of failure, and consequences of failure. Improve your assessment ability as he discusses opportunities for avoiding false precision and making the process more repeatable.
