As part of its mission to restore and protect the Cuyahoga watershed and adjacent Lake Erie tributaries in northern Ohio, the nonprofit Cuyahoga RESTORATION River Restoration identified the need to raise awareness of the significant

role arborists play where trees, communities, and watersheds intersect, as well as emphasize the importance of healthy urban forests to the health of the watershed. More than 150 representatives of tree commissions, municipalities, and the public from 53 communities participated in "Tree Training Intensives" workshops (partially funded by an Ohio Chapter ISA Education Grant administered by TREE Fund), in Cleveland, Lorain, and Toledo, Ohio. The event successfully strengthened connections between these communities and the people who care for their trees, and it helped them share the message that urban forests are essential parts of a community's infrastructure.
