Rubber, Meet Road: Important Tour Details from our Director

Pre- and Post-Tour Lodging at the Millennium Maxwell House Nashville Hotel

- There are a limited number of rooms available 3 days prior to the Tour start date on September 15th and 3 days after the Tour's last included hotel stay on September 20th. The group rate is \$135 + 15.25% occupancy tax.

Getting your bike to the Tour

- Label your bike box with your name and "TREE Fund Tour des Trees Paul Wood"
- Time your shipment to arrive between September 11-13th
- I recommend using **Bike Flights** to ship your bike. It is simple and very cost effective.
- There is a \$25 per box fee for receiving and storage of your bike box at the hotel
- There will also be an option to ship your box to a local affiliate for storage before the tour, more details regarding this option are yet to come.

Fundraising Secrets from a Professional Tree Lover

- Spin at your annual conference. Especially if you have a trade show. Place your bike/booth at the entryway so you can see/harass everyone as they come and go. Create a sticker for donor name tags so you can shame those that don't have one, and, even more important, so you don't accidentally try to hit your donors up again. Have subgroups compete (e.g. commercial, utility, municipal arborists, etc.) and mark their progress on a big chart so you can use that as a carrot. There are lots of possibilities for other competitions like having them guess how fast you can go or how many miles you can ride during the conference, etc.
- If you ask for a pledge instead of an on-thespot donation, you can often get a much bigger donation, though you have to do the work of billing/reminding them later.
- Create a team of fundraisers to help you (not a team of riders, but fundraisers who are not riding). Recruit folks that have a lot of connections – company owners, exhibitors, elder states people; or recruit friends or students who want to meet some of the connected people.
- Make it personal for the donor. Sell them on why this cause is not only crucial to urban forestry, but also to them at a personal level!

Training Guidance

- Here is a podcast that provides some good information about preparing for a Haute Route (which is similar to the Tour) -VeloNews Fast Talk
- Spring has arrived, so you should shift your focus with the time you have available to train from cross training to riding your bike...yay! But don't neglect strength training to maintain your core and counteract the imbalances that cycling imposes on your body.
- There are so many good points made during the VeloNews Podcast but a few of the ones that resonated with me are:
 - A key component to proper preparation is consistency.
 - Another is to try as best you can to mimic the demands of the Tour both in the daily demands and those posed by riding long distance for consecutive days.
- In an upcoming Ride Guide I will provide more detail about the 2019 TdT route to give you a glimpse of what is in store for you this year.
- A critical strategy in completing the Tour successfully and enjoyably is to "ride within yourself". Don't be tempted to overextend yourself. Pacing and paying attention to refueling/ hydration is vital!
- There is a responsibility of riding predictably when cycling within a group or pack. Along with riding predictably it is very important to communicate effectively within your pack.
- Arrive at the Tour with your body, mind and bike prepared!
