### Welcome!

We are so glad you are joining us for the 2019 Tour des Trees.

### **Tour des Trees Safety: Best Practices**

Each year we strive to refine the elements of and suggested practices of being safe Tour des Trees cyclists. This evolution comes from reading current research and incorporating the best practices gained from that research. Last year we made a big push to incorporate the utilization of Daytime Running Lights within our pack, and I was incredibly proud of how many of you heeded the recommendation and were sporting lights during the Tour. Here is the latest video produced by Trek regarding DRL's. I am not promoting a specific brand, there are numerous manufacturers out there that make viable DRL's. The best one is the one you'll use!

This year I'd like to introduce what I consider to be best practices for ensuring your safety on the roadways we face as we promote TREE Fund's message in the many urban centers we encounter along the way. While not all will be comfortable with the practices of controlling the lane, I am a strong proponent of the "7 Behaviors of Successful Cyclists" promoted by CyclingSavvy in their **Mastery Intro video**. Those 7 practices are:

I. Be Visible, Predictable and Relevant 5. Communicate

2. Be Observant

6. Cooperate

3. Be Mindful

7. Respect Yourself

4. Be Strategic

One of my favorite phrases and take-aways in this video is "Predictive Decision Making". The two principles of predictive decision making and effective communication will go a long way in keeping us safe in traffic and within our respective packs.

Law Enforcement: Understanding Cyclists' Position on the Roadway is another great video by CyclingSavvy about the concerns we have as a narrow vehicle (bicycle) and less visible road user. This video demonstrates the value of lane position (control). I fully understand our reluctance to impede traffic, but remember, we are traffic. Also keep in mind that many things cause momentary delay on the road, such as traffic signals, railroad crossings, vehicles that make routine stops, like delivery trucks and city buses, farm equipment...our safety depends on our ability to be Predictable & Relevant, Observant, Mindful, Strategic, Effective Communicators, Cooperative, and to Respect our Right to the Roadway!
