When the pandemic hit in 2020 and shut down nearly every fundraising event that benefitted the TREE Fund--including the Tour des Trees and the



many events annually held by ISA chapters and TREE Fund partners--things looked very dark. Indeed, the heartbreaking loss of lives, health, and jobs, and the unspeakable grief that followed, shrouded the year with a heavy pall. A remarkable combination of quick action, budget cuts, creativity, and generosity sustained the TREE Fund into 2021.

Thankfully, we are still here in 2021. We are still funding the time-honored grants and scholarships, still committed to supporting the research and education that contributes so much to arboriculture, our communities, our economy, and our planet, as well as enriching our lives in myriad ways.

Unfortunately the pandemic is also still here. As of this writing, a surge of new infections is preventing us from either returning to normal or creating a new normal. Still, we press on through the dark.

It's in this long darkness, as Lamott noted, that our hope is born. The TREE Fund is determined to "show up and try to do the right thing." So the Tour des Trees returns as a live event in a couple of weeks, with prudent precautions in place and a virtual option for those who prefer it. The Tour des Trees is important for many reasons. 
